More information about asbestos

All asbestos must be delivered in sealed, closed and transparent plastic packaging (preferably double-wrapped).

Among other things, you can deliver:

- Whole and crushed Eternit sheets
- Whole and crushed sheets containing asbestos fibres (Eternit, wall and ceiling cladding)
- Whole and crushed sheets of Eternit slate
- Asbestos from metal pipes/heating pipes and hot water tanks
- Dust and sludge from cleaning asbestos-containing roof sheets
- Filters from roof cleaning
- Moss and leaves from cleaning roofs with asbestos-containing roof sheets
- Insulation material with asbestos from, e.g. district heating pipes

A maximum of 20 sheets can be delivered each day. Please contact the staff when delivering as the containers are locked.

Take care of yourself

Asbestos dust is extremely hazardous to health and is therefore classified as hazardous waste. We need to make sure that asbestos-containing dust cannot spread either on the way to the recycling centre or at the recycling centre when you deliver your waste.

Therefore, ALL asbestos materials MUST be packed in sealed, closed and transparent plastic packaging. For example, use strong, sealed, transparent plastic bags/film sealed with tape. Please use double-wrapped packaging, as there is a risk of the packaging splitting. The packaging requirement applies to whole sheets, crushed sheets and roof cleaning residues. Asbestos-containing building materials must be in double-wrapped packaging on delivery.

Remember that there is always a health risk when handling asbestos/Eternit. You should use suitable respiratory protection.
